Dr. Craig Orgeron called the meeting to order.

Dr. Craig Orgeron called for a motion to approve the minutes of the May 15, 2012 meeting if no changes were needed. Mr. Bill Pope made the motion to accept the minutes, it was seconded by Ms. Karana Carroll, and the motion passed with none opposed.

Ms. Deanna Gronlie with Mississippi Interactive (MSI) gave an update on the status of all current projects.

Ms. Gronlie discussed projects in the queue for approval by the committee. MSI has been approached with at least 10 cities and/or counties to discuss payment services and website presence. No vote was needed for any current or new items.

Ms. Cille Litchfield moved approval of the project queue as presented. Clay Johnston seconded, and the motion passed with none opposed.

Craig Orgeron discussed recent meetings with the Department of Health and informed the committee that the service for electronic fulfillment of Vital Records will be competitively bid

and that we would examine all points of the business model to ensure that the cost to citizens does not increase due to the change in payment processor.

Ms. Cathilea Robinette with the Centers for Digital Government gave an overview of trends in eGovernment across all states and some tips for improving our efforts in Mississippi.

The next meeting will be held on August 21, 2012, at 1:30 p.m. in the ITS Board Room.
