Mr. Daniel Jordan called the meeting to order.

Mr. Jordan called for a motion to approve the minutes of the December 16, 2025 meeting if no changes were needed. Mr. Brian Ferguson made the motion to accept the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Mickey Yates and passed with none opposed.

Ms. Tina Wells presented the Portal Highlights and Current Projects portion of the EOC reports:

**2025 Closeout of Products for Tyler:**

- 22 Services Launched
- 1 AI Powered Resident Assistant for MISSI on MS.gov
- 19 National Awards
- 234 Total Program Awards

Tyler worked with the Mississippi Department of Revenue to deliver a no cost enhancement to their Quickpay service updates. With this update, it will assist citizens with a quick and easy way to pay their taxes and any other related services. They have gained a 25% total year over year growth, a growth of 85% over December 2024 year prior. Since the service launched in 2019, the Department of Revenue has processed \$293 million.

The Online Renewal and Licensing Payment processing for the Mississippi Autism Board launched in 2024 and the monthly transactions have nearly doubled compared to the initial launch period.

Tyler collaborated with the Mississippi Secretary of State to update and enhance the Business One Stop Shop (BOSS) application. This update is to provide easier access to information for individuals wanting to start a business.

### **The Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks**

- Hunting and Fishing Payment Processing
  - The integration took four months and was completed on time.
  - Auto-renewals are now available through the use of Tyler Wallet Payments
  - Online payment transparency and reporting are now aligned with the State's other online payment services.
  
- The Mississippi State Parks payment processing is still ongoing with MDWFP and Tyler. They are finalizing the scope and executing documentation for the timeline. It is anticipated that this will be a 13-month runway and will begin weekly status calls with Tyler and MDWFP Parks Reservations Department.

Tyler launched this exciting new AGO In Action Mobile App in January. It connects Mississippians to important resources at their fingertips from the Attorney General's office. It improves public safety and accessibility. This is another great avenue that allows everyone to stay informed on the AGO's initiatives and public events.

The Mississippi Department of Public Safety met with Tyler to discuss modernizing their Crime Stoppers Reporting and Assessment Forms. These forms are currently online as pdfs and excel spreadsheets. DPS wants to convert these paper processes into online applications for better usage of authentication, log ins and credentials.

The City of Farmington, Mississippi launched a new no cost Template Website. This new website will assist the citizens with a user-friendly tool to help them locate important information for the town and what's going on in the area.

Tyler worked with the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality to help modernize their payments with the following features:

- Automate Invoicing
- Automate Fee Calculation
- Advanced Financial Reporting
- Improve Accuracy
- Provide Trackable Workflows

Ms. Wells discussed the status of projects in development and presented the following projects for Prioritization Approval:
