Mr. Daniel Jordan called the meeting to order.

Mr. Daniel Jordan called for a motion to approve the minutes of the June 17, 2025, meeting if no changes were needed. Ms. Gilda Reyes made the motion to accept the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Kurt Turner and passed with none opposed.

Ms. LaTonya Kirkland presented the history and purpose of the EOC to the new members.

Ms. Tina Wells discussed the following:

Mr. Brian Ferguson with the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks requested extending the temporary waiver of the EOC fee for the new Parks and Reservations system through October 30, 2025.

Mr. Daniel Jordan called for a motion to approve the request. Mr. Tommy Goodwin made the motion to approve, and the motion was seconded by Mr. Mickey Yates. The request was passed with one opposed.

Ms. Tina Wells reviewed the Portal Highlights and Current Projects portion of the EOC reports:

Tyler has partnered with the following state agencies and entities for the months of June and July:

- Transparency Mississippi portal has been in partnership with Tyler along with the Department of Finance and Administration since 2013 which allows citizens access to the state's activities.
 - Public Access to Data
 - Partnership for Transparency
 - Growing Engagement
- Mississippi Real Estate Appraisal Board
 - Tyler is in the process of moving their Temporary License Applications into the Engagement Builder platform. The goal is to create a workforce that is easier to navigate and online payments.
- Mississippi Division of Medicaid
 - New website redesign built on Drupal
 - Modern approach to handling Public Records Request
- Mississippi Medical Cannabis Program
 - Mobile Application built on the MyCivic Platform in collaboration with the Mississippi Department of Health
- Mississippi State Board of Nursing
 - A new schedule for RN and LPN has been launched to handle all license payment renewals.
- The City of Rolling Fork has launched a new town website. This website will help the citizens in the on-going efforts to recover from the devastating tornado that hit the city. This was a non-cost website built using the Magnolia template.
- Mississippi Department of Employment Security
 - Launched a new website for the Governor's Job Fair Event Registrations
 - Modern, user-friendly design with real-time editing and flexible customization.
 - Streamlined workflows that boost efficiency, reduce administrative effort, and improve experiences for staff and employers
 - Registrants now can pay at the time of registration or later using a link
- Mississippi Board of Psychology

- Tyler is working with this agency to create an online training course.
- The goal is to find a cost effective and flexible course that both the students and professors can navigate and enjoy.
