Ms. Stephanie Hedgepeth called the meeting to order.

Ms. Stephanie Hedgepeth called for a motion to approve the minutes of the August 19, 2025, meeting if no changes were needed. Ms. Gilda Reyes made the motion to accept the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Tommy Goodwin and passed with none opposed.

Mr. Brian Ferguson gave an update on the transition to the standard payment process for Parks/Reservations. He stated the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks would like to meet with ITS to discuss the contractual obligations. The attorneys for MDWFP will contact ITS to set up a meeting.

Ms. Tina Wells presented the Portal Highlights and Current Projects portion of the EOC reports:

- Stone County School District Website was launched. A no-cost user-friendly site that gives students, staff and parents quick access to everything that will need to make the scholars productive in the classroom.
- Mississippi Department of Rehabilitation Services Website Updates

- Consolidation removes duplicate hosting, lowering ongoing costs for MDRS
- Self-service editing lets agency staff publish updates in minutes, improving responsiveness
- Seamless redirect from betheirvoicenow.com maintains campaign visibility and reach
- DPS Payment Processing Device Upgrade
 - Enhanced Security & Regulatory Compliance
 - Faster Services
 - Modern Convenience
- Mississippi State Board of Medical Licensure
 - Conversations have started to modernize some of their projects and digital services. During these conversations, Tyler introduced them to the Resident AI Chatbot Platform. Next steps are to show a demo of the Resident Assistant that can be customized to support their needs.
- Mississippi Department of Agriculture & Commerce
 - Genuine MS® Cashiering Solution – Tyler has started initial conversations with MDAC to discuss updating their OTC POS solutions. This is a web-based solution that would streamline their retail operations.
- Mississippi Department of Revenue Website
 - At the end of September, the DOR website was relaunched. This new website is driven by a new modernized citizen’s digital experience.
- Mississippi Department of Child Protection Services
 - Tyler met with CPS’ Communications Department to demo the Resident Assistant AI ChatBot which delivers round-the-clock access to questions/answers and inquiries when a Customer Service Representative is unavailable.

Mr. David Campbell conducted an overview of the Portal Security and Infrastructure.

- Uptime Report
 - Last 3 Months: 99.96%
 - Since 01/04/2025: 99.89%
 - FYTD 26: 99.96%
- Infrastructure Cloud Migration
 - First application has been migrated to AWS Sandbox
 - Working with ITS on connection with State Network from AWS
 - Working with Tyler CMS Centers of Excellence team to determine best fit and options for Drupal Hosting
 - Migrating Authentication to Tyler Identity Gateway

- Scheduled Maintenance
 - Production
 - Enterprise application updates first maintenance window each month.
 - Infrastructure Upgrades and Maintenance second maintenance window of the month.
 - Security patching for Windows and Linux third maintenance window of the month.
 - Lower Environments
 - Development, Test, and User Acceptance Testing
 - Security patching for Windows and Linux are completed one to two weeks prior to Production Security patching.
- Security
 - Up to date with Windows and Linux Patching.
 - Annual Holistic Pentest Scheduled for Q3
 - Tyler's Security and Compliance Assessment Program is reviewed by TrustWave.
 - The Assessment period is April 1st through March 31st annually.

Mr. Campbell presented an update on the PCI Compliance Program.

The next meeting is scheduled for December 16, 2025.

Ms. Hedgepeth mentioned the Department of Justice's Title II ADA: Accessibility Compliance project that goes into effect April 26, 2026. Tyler will be hosting a Lunch and Learn event at ITS on Wednesday, November 12, 2025, to get pertinent details and information about this endeavor. More information will be coming soon.

Ms. Gilda Reyes made a motion that the meeting be adjourned. Mr. Tommy Goodwin seconded, and the motion was approved with no one opposed. The meeting was adjourned.
